**UWC-USA TO SCREEN *9500 LIBERTY*:
A DOCUMENTARY ABOUT ONE BATTLE OVER IMMIGRATION POLICY IN THE US**

Montezuma, New Mexico – October 26, 2010 – UWC-USA will be screening the documentary film ***9500 Liberty*** on Friday, November 12, 2010, at 7 pm.

9500 Liberty examines immigration policy in the US, documenting Prince William County, Virginia where a short-lived “probable cause” policy, implemented in 2007, mandated that Police officers question anyone they suspected to be an undocumented immigrant.

9500 Liberty explores the local response to Prince William County’s “probable cause” policy in the year leading up to its implementation, documenting the virtual resistance from residents who used YouTube videos and virtual meeting spaces in a resolute effort to repeal the policy. Just two months after its implementation, the policy was repealed due to resident resistance and its devastating economic and social effects on the Virginia County. Best-selling author, John Grisham, states: “***9500 Liberty*** makes it clear that when we, as a nation of immigrants, debate the immigration issue, we are defining our very identity as Americans.”

9500 Liberty will be screened in UWC-USA’s Kluge Auditorium at 7 pm, on Friday, November 12, 2010. It will be screened again at the First United Presbyterian Church at 2 pm, on Sunday, November 14, 2010.
